



As we acknowledge the 50th anniversary of Earth Day without gatherings and major celebratory events, work does continue. The original Muncie Action Plan included various action steps aimed at Earth Day principles, such as reducing carbon footprints and creating a Muncie energy office. Since that time, particularly in the last 3 years, background work has been done leading up to the creation of the Planet Muncie Committee – a subcommittee of the MAP Task Force 5 Initiative that began meeting earlier this year.

The Committee will build on the work done by an immersive learning class lead by Dr. David Hua in 2017 which included some data collection efforts based on survey responses to questions designed to assess community knowledge of sustainability related resources and priorities. Additionally, a 2019 project involving an extern from Indiana University working with the Delaware-Muncie Metropolitan Plan Commission created some baseline green house gas inventory datasets for Muncie and Delaware County.

The Planet Muncie Committee intends to host a summit that will allow attendees to discuss their current activities and identify potential collaborations. There would also be presentations, reports on existing activities, and possible guest speakers. The original goal was for this to occur later in 2020 but the time table is currently fluid.
