



# Web of Support Everybody Succeeds

# Webbing up our community for greater resilience in a time of pandemic

In every iteration of Muncie Action Plan (MAP), community members identified developing a "mentoring program" as a priority. People want youth and children to have mentors in order to prevent them engaging in risky behaviors, and they also want mentors for themselves.

Derek Peterson, an international speaker and founder of the Institute for Community and Adolescent Resiliency, has studied the value of positive adult role models and mentorship. Through his research for the federal government, Derek discovered several key factors—including how many mentors youth need to reduce risky behavior and become more resilient, healthy, happy adults.

At the start of 2020, MAP brought Derek to Muncie to train 100 ambassadors, 50 adults and 50 young adults, on the Web of Support and how we can build it here in Muncie to form a more resilient community. This group had just begun to give presentations and increase support for

building a culture locally in which youth are empowered to identify and recruit supportive adults, and those adults have diverse support systems to support the youth's success.

Just as MAP and the ambassadors were poised to launch this grassroots initiative and, COVID-19 hit. Eager to not lose momentum, Derek worked with the ambassadors and offered a Zoom training to further build on their understanding of how webs of support strengthen resiliency in a crisis. A smaller core contingent of ambassadors then commenced participating in a four week "Deep Dive" into building and promoting Web of Support.

Future of Work Coordinator for Sustainable Muncie Kyra Zylstra has been integrally involved with this effort. She worked with Derek and his partner Laura to create all the materials for the Deep Dive training and helped craft a creative project challenge for the two Deep Dive groups.

"The Deep Dive discussions have created an incredible depth of connection and community among the participants in such a short time. It has been incredible to see vulnerability, resilience and care for others not just being discussed, but truly lived out and exemplified," Kyra shared.

Chandra Parks president of the Southside Neighborhood Association and Jacqui Hanoman executive director of the Ross Community Center have been leading the two Deep Dive groups. Muncie Community Schools faculty and students have also participated in the groups. The sessions, which end the first week in June, will culminate with the creation of two creative projects to start promoting the grassroots initiative locally.

"We are so excited to unveil the creative projects these groups are preparing that share a message of hope, strength and gratitude that affirms the unique resilience that connects our community," Kyra said.
